

Why Does My Longarmer Require So Much Extra Backing Fabric?

Have you ever wondered why your longarmer requires such a substantial amount of backing fabric? If so, you are not alone. Understanding this requirement is more signi-



ficant than you might realize. The accompanying image illustrates a quilt loaded onto the longarm machine, with the quilt top being the smallest layer, the batting slightly larger, and the backing even larger still. This arrangement is intentional and essential for both the longarmer and the longarm machine to perform their tasks efficiently, ultimately ensuring optimal results for the finished quilt.
